INDUSTRY LOWDOWN

In 2016 government figures showed there were 503,900 teachers, 387,900 teaching assistants and 450,900 support staff working in UK schools. These figures have increased year on year since 2010, and more teachers and support staff are in demand for the growing population. Those already involved in Early Years work may: move into a management role via business and leadership courses; specific areas such as assessment via additional qualifications; or teaching older children by achieving Qualified Teacher Status (QTS).

HOW MUCH WILL MY COURSE COST?

WHAT DOES THE COURSE FEE COVER?

Fees comprise of a tuition fee and examination/registration fee for first attempts, in line with the College fees policy. You will be required to meet the costs of any re-sit examinations or additional exam-related costs that you incur. In certain circumstances, remission or help with the fees/costs may be given to you.

HOW DO I PAY FOR MY COURSE?

Fees are due at the time of enrolment and can be paid by cash, cheque, or credit card. You may be able to pay fees in instalments by standing order where the total due is over £600, or you are in receipt of a student loans company letter (Advanced Learner Loan).

FUNDING YOUR STUDY

There are a number of options available to assist you in financing your studies.

Depending on your circumstances, you may be entitled to free tuition at Level 1, 2 or 3.

STUDY NOW, PAY LATER WITH ADVANCED LEARNER LOANS

Have all the benefits of gaining the qualification without any of the upfront fees (not subject to means testing or credit checks). You will only have to pay the loan back when you are in full-time employment and earning over £25,000 per year. In the event that you have a loan and leave the course you will be responsible for paying the remainder of the course fees.

FUNDING DEGREE-LEVEL STUDY

When studying a University Level Qualification there are two main associated costs; tuition fees and living costs. Tuition fees are dependent on the qualification you study and living costs are the associated costs of studying and include expenses such as books, rent and travel. Tuition Fee Loans and Maintenance Loans are available to help spread the cost of degree level study.

Do I need to study at degree level to progress my career?

To become a nurse, midwife or a teacher, you will need to study a degree-level qualification

Are there any skills I could transfer into a management role?

Yes, many areas of management are not unique to healthcare, such as finance, human resources, purchasing or hotel services management.

You may therefore have gained skills in another role (within or outside of the health sector) and be able to use these in a management role.

Do you need to have worked in the health sector before applying for management posts?

No. However, there are some more senior roles that may require experience of managing resources in a healthcare environment.
